



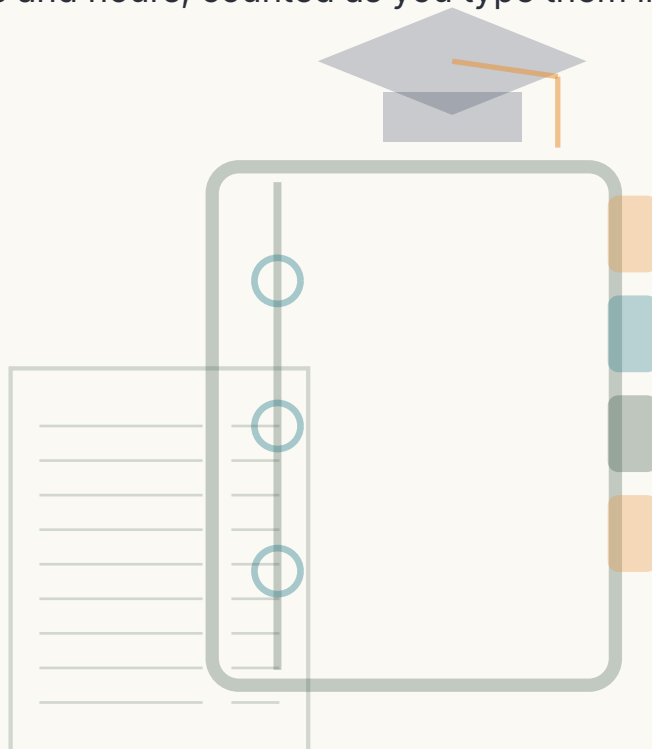

Homeschool Attendance & Hours Log

One learner, one tab — days and hours, counted as you type them in.

One learner. Every school day and hour, counted as you go.

The Homeschool Attendance & Hours Log is a single free tab: one row per school day, plus a weekly row per subject for hours. Type a day code and it counts toward your target the moment you type it; log hours by subject and the Hours by subject table splits them out. It opens already holding Ivy (example) — a first-year high schooler — with 90 weekdays already coded and 102 hours entries (one per subject per week) already logged, through December 18, 2026: 80.5 of her 180 target days counted and 401.5 of 900 target hours logged. That way you can see it working before you log a day of your own.

1. Type a code for each school day — P for a full day, H for a half day, S for sick, B for a break, or F/C/T for a field trip, co-op day or testing day.
2. Days counted, still to go, and percent of target update the moment you tab off the cell — no button, nothing to run.
3. Log hours as you go: date, subject, how many hours, and what was done. The Hours by subject table adds each subject's hours, share of the total, and entry count.
4. This starter only totals what has already happened — it does not project a pace or a finish date the way the full binder does.
5. To start your own year, change Your year (learner, first/last day, targets) and keep the Day codes table, then clear the example codes in C29:C290, the notes in E29:E290, and the example hours in G29:J130.
6. For Google Sheets, upload the .xlsx to Google Drive and open it with Google Sheets.

Code	Meaning	Counts as
P	School day	1
H	Half day	0.5
F	Field trip	1
C	Co-op or outside class	1
T	Testing day	1
S	Sick day	0

Code	Meaning	Counts as
B	Break or holiday	0

How a day counts. Each code in the Day codes table has a “counts as” weight — a full school day counts as 1, a half day as 0.5, and a sick day or a break as 0. The table is editable: change a meaning or a weight and the log's dropdown and its day-counting formula both follow, because they read the table rather than a fixed list.

How hours by subject add up. Every hours row names a subject from the dropdown. The Hours by subject table sums the Hours column for each subject with a SUMIF, so a subject with no rows yet simply reads zero — there is nothing to set up first.

One learner's days and hours. The full Homeschool Records Binder turns them into finished courses.

This starter counts one learner's school days and hours against the targets you set. It keeps no course behind those hours beyond a subject name, no second learner, and no sense of pace against the calendar.

WHAT THE FULL HOMESCHOOL RECORDS BINDER ADDS

Every learner's hours flow straight into a **credit** on the Courses tab, rounded and capped the way you set it up, and a one-page **Transcript** lists them with a weighted and unweighted GPA.
