



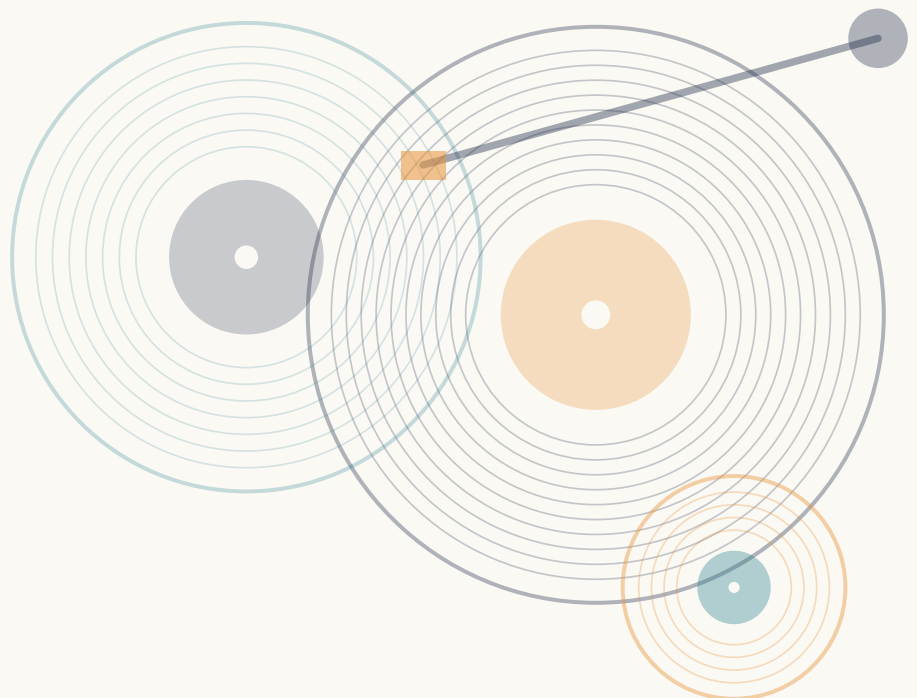

A personal collection log — not an appraisal or a price guide.

Your records, in one list

This free starter is one tab. A row per record — artist, title, format, year — and one column that says whether you have it or you are still hunting it. That single flag is why the shelf and the wantlist belong in the same file: the record you are about to buy is right next to the 9 you already own.

How to use it

- **Open it and start typing.** It comes pre-loaded with a small fictional collection so nothing looks empty; select those rows and press Delete when you are ready to put your own in.
- **Set Have or Want on every row.** The three counts at the top — records you have, records you want, formats logged — keep themselves current.
- **Take the wantlist with you.** The whole point of keeping it in the same file is that you can check it standing in a shop, before you buy the record you already own.
- **Use the Notes column.** Six months on it is not the row that helps you, it is the sentence next to it — taped seam, faint tick on side two, ring wear.

What this starter deliberately does not do

It counts. It does not value. A list tells you what you own; it cannot tell you that the copy in front of you, in the condition it is actually in, is worth roughly a quarter of a near-mint one on the scale collectors use — which is the number that decides whether you buy it.

WHAT THE FULL WORKBOOK ADDS

Grade the record **and** the sleeve separately, and a grade-adjusted value falls out of your own near-mint figure. A wantlist that prices the copy in front of you at the grade it is in and compares it to the ceiling you set at home. A duplicate guard that catches the album you already own on another format. Cost per play, a rotation flag, and stylus hours counted from your own play log. A live dashboard, an eight-grade condition scale with editable multipliers, three PDF guides including a pocket wantlist card, and a one-click Google Sheets copy. Neither looks up, fetches, or estimates what anything is worth, and neither is an appraisal, a price guide, or investment advice. The example collection is fictional — every artist and album title in it is invented. Created with AI assistance under Ardent Workshop's creative direction, then reviewed and edited before release.
